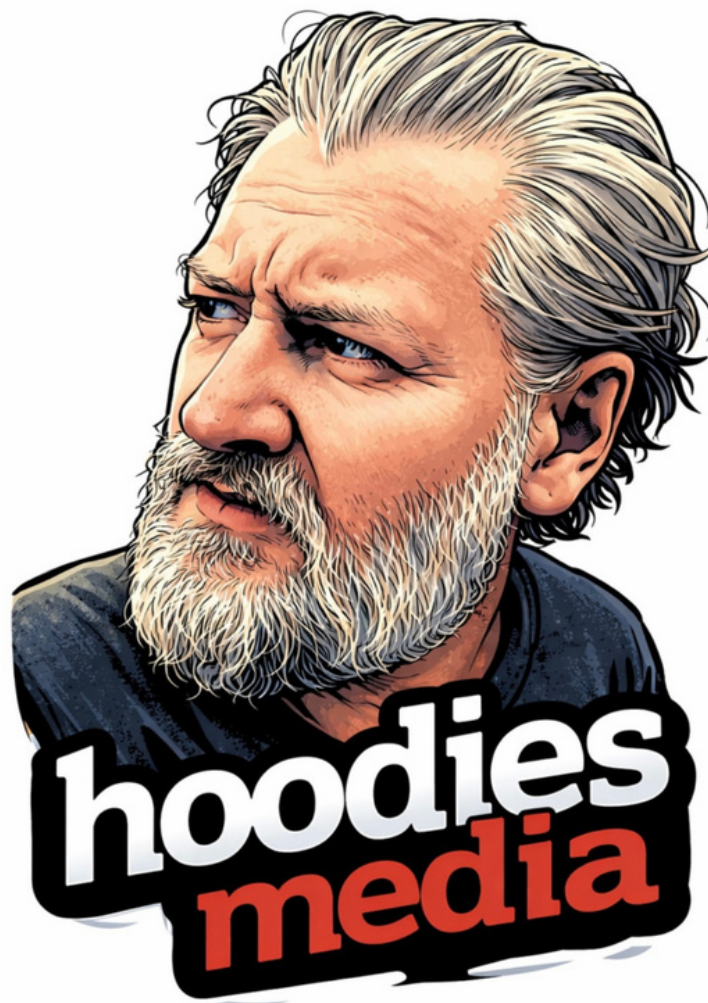

\$25 per job ad or \$100 for 5 valid for six months.

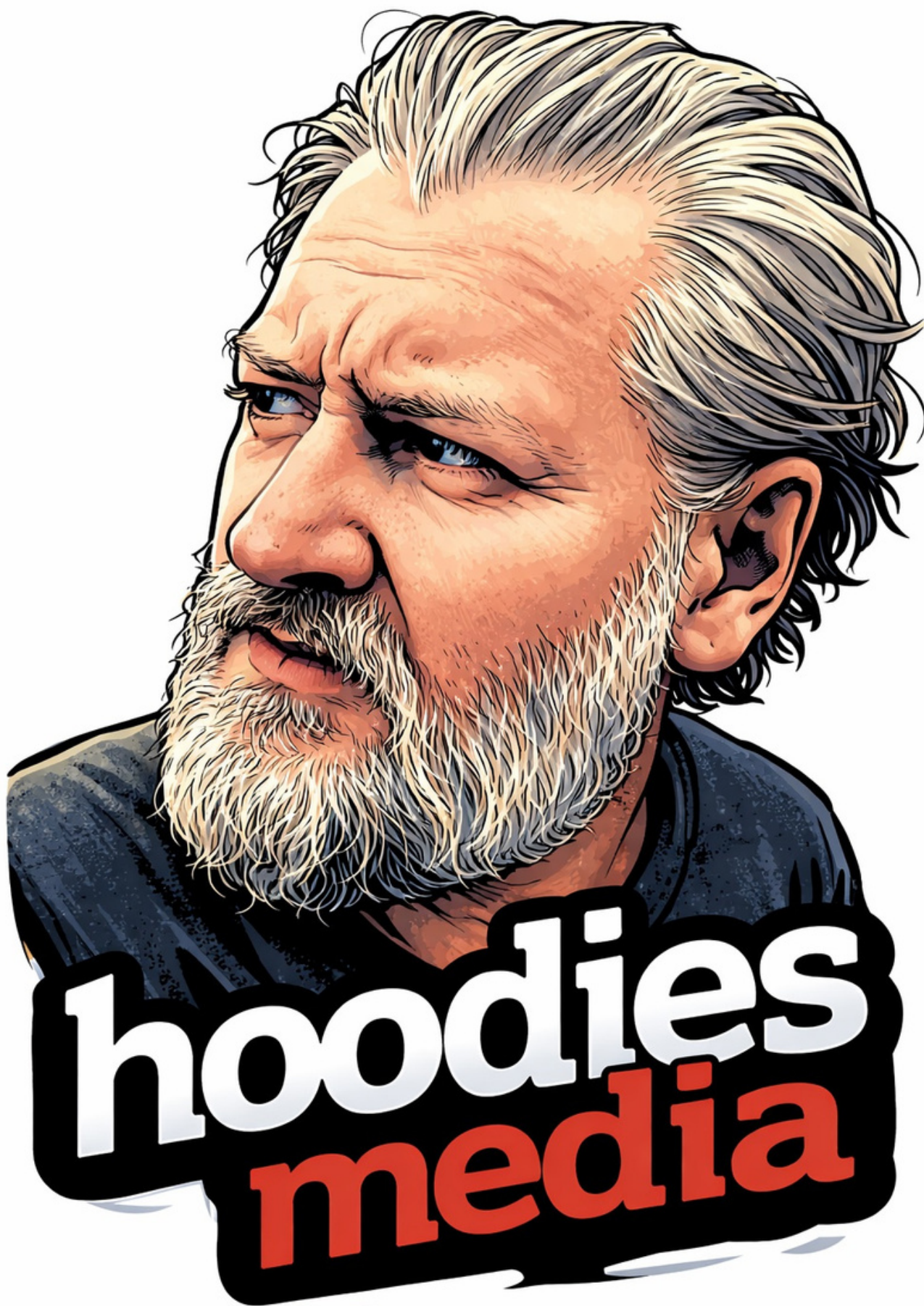
That's it! We simply want as many people as possible to find the right hospitality job and employers to connect to the right candidates.
